

Despite the chill in the air, the community came out in support of Double Dogs, a Cannabis supplier with five Montana stores and a sixth one coming to Plentywood.

Sunday was a day of frisbee golf where people got to compete in a friendly competition and where Double Dogs raised money for MonDak Animal Rescue of Williston, N.D.

"This is the first of many," said Double Dogs Events Coordinator Kevin Hunter.

Hunter said the benefit was appropriate because of the business's love of their own dogs of which Double Dogs got its name.

He said while many local animal hospitals can shelter strays for a day or two, only MonDak Animal Rescue was the closest animal shelter where pets are transported to.

Many area businesses donated something to the fundraiser: Gift cards, store discounts, and products including an outdoor grill from Ace Hardware.

Tractor Supply was giving away a pet starter kit to the first two winners and a 50 percent discount for the rest of the participants. The starter kits include a bed, bag of food, a collar and leash, and kennel. Cat kits also included a litter box.

"We are letting the community know that we want to be a part of the community," Hunter said. "This is a way of giving back."

Double Dogs has a store just outside Sidney and they are expanding to Plentywood.

Plentywood General Manager Jacob Strouth said the Plentywood store is three times bigger than Sidney's store selling Cannabis and Cannabis-related products.

Plentywood is served by two other Cannabis businesses. Double Dogs will be the third to compete in the market.

"This is a day of sharing what we are about - a friendly day of competition," Strouth said of frisbee golf fundraising.

Plans are in the works for a fundraising event next August during the Sidney store's anniversary of its opening serving the community.
